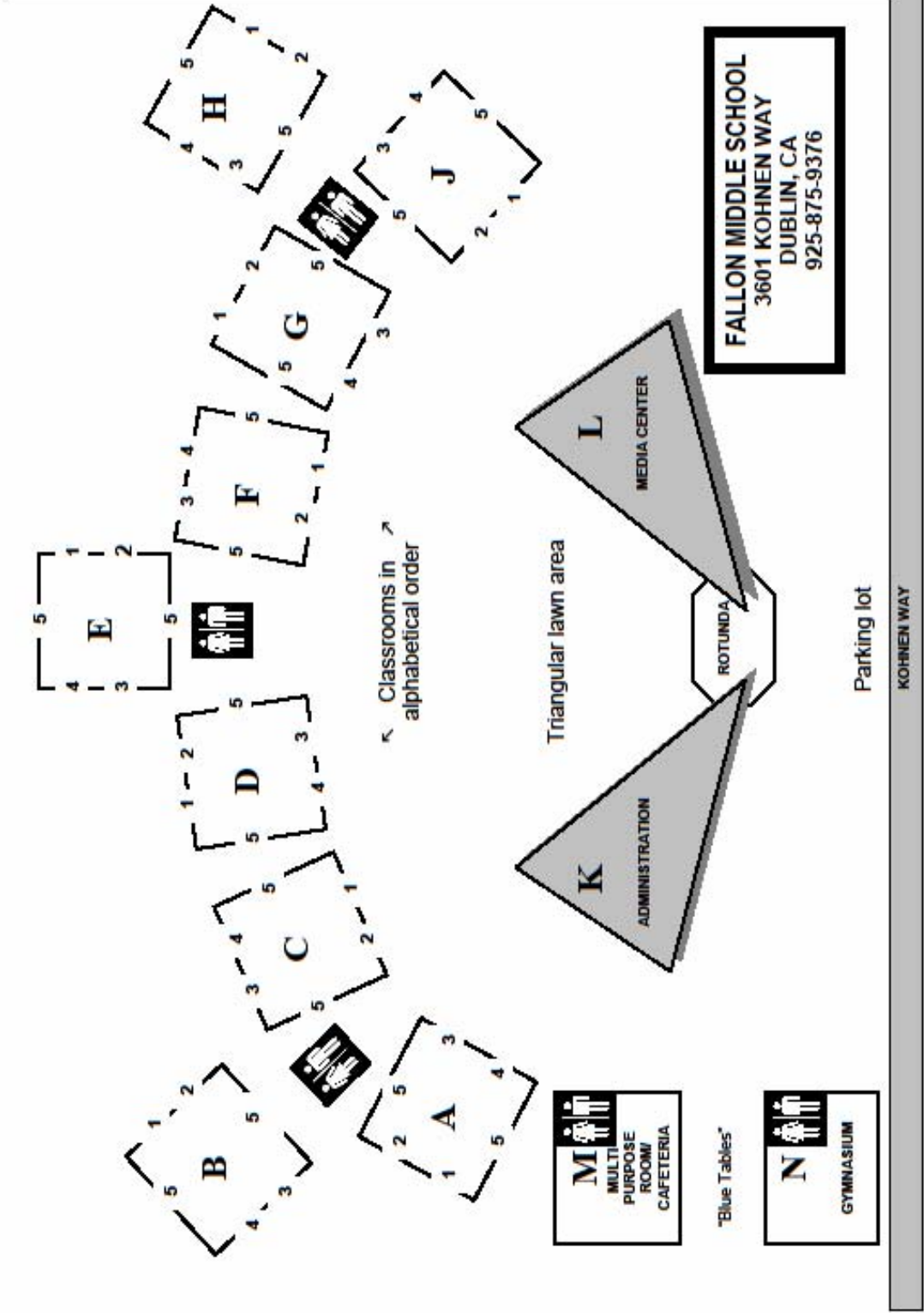

ACADEMIC PROGRAM

School is a time to explore new subjects, try new activities, and develop the habits that will help you succeed in life. Your classes will be interesting and challenging. Keeping up with your work is crucial. If you are confused about your assignments or need extra help, be sure to seek assistance.

◆HOMWORK

Good grades happen when students keep up with their work. To help you remember your homework assignments, keep the telephone numbers of two or three friends who are in your classes in your student planner. These are the people to call when you have questions about your assignments. Make sure to utilize your student planner. Many teachers maintain current "homework hotlines" or web sites to assist students and parents.

◆FIELD TRIPS

Although out of class educational experiences are important parts of the school experience, school sponsored activities are considered absences. Students are expected to meet due dates and turn in all missed work while attending field trips and extracurricular events. It is the student's responsibility to arrange to make up assignments.

◆REPORT CARDS

Report cards will be mailed quarterly on the dates noted in the school calendar. Teachers will review the grading policy the first week of school. "Back to School Night" will afford the parents the opportunity to understand performance expectations and grading.

◆WEEKLY PROGRESS CHECKS

Grades may be seen by students and parents by utilizing the Student and Parent Portal. Parents sign up for this at registration or may inquire in the office. A weekly progress check by parents might be helpful for some students. Students may pick these forms up in the office. Please contact teachers directly in the event you choose to initiate this method of monitoring your student's progress.

◆PROMOTION/RETENTION

Fallon School will follow the district adopted promotion/retention policy.

◆EIGHTH GRADE PROMOTION CEREMONY

Students who achieve at least a 1.75 overall GPA will be honored in June with a promotion ceremony. Promotion to high school does not automatically guarantee participation in this ceremony.

ATTENDANCE

Daily school attendance is vital to a student's academic progress. Unless students are seriously ill, they need to be in school. Please schedule medical and dental appointments after school hours whenever possible.

◆AUTOMATIC DIALER

An automated phone dialer will make calls if your student is marked absent from the school day. Please call the office and clear unexcused absences.

◆ARRIVAL/DEPARTURE FROM SCHOOL

For safety reasons, students should not arrive more than 15 minutes before the bell rings unless attending a supervised activity, such as breakfast or teacher tutorials. Students should leave campus within 15 minutes after the bell rings unless in a supervised activity such as extracurricular activities, academic support programs, or detention. In these cases, students should exit campus 15 minutes after the end of these activities.

◆ABSENCE NOTES

All absences **MUST BE VERIFIED BY PHONE OR BY A NOTE** from a parent/guardian or doctor. A student who has been absent during the school day is not eligible to participate in student activities that take place after school on the same day, unless cleared by an administrator.

◆TRUANCY

Any student who has 3 or more days of unverified absence in a school year is a truant (California Ed Code 48260). Students with excessive absences and/or tardies will be referred to the Student Attendance Review Board (SARB). If you know that your student will be out for five days or more, contact the office at least two weeks in advance for possible options such as Independent Study.

◆TARDY POLICY

▶ **LATE TO SCHOOL:** Students who arrive late must obtain a pass from the office to enter their classroom. Late arrival after 8:45am

requires a note from a parent or doctor. If a note is not available, a parent must accompany their student to the office and sign them in.

- ▶ **TARDY TO CLASS:** Students are expected to be in their assigned room when the bell rings.

Students who are frequently tardy will face disciplinary action.

GENERAL INFORMATION

◆SCHOOL MATERIALS

Only materials needed for learning or school activities are to be brought to school. Personal items should be appropriately stored once on campus.

Fallon School will not be responsible for lost, stolen, or confiscated items.

- ▶ Bicycles, scooters, and skateboards must be operated in a safe manner to and from school. They are NOT to be ridden on campus at any time and **MUST** be stored in the bicycle rack. **Students are required by law to wear helmets.**
- ▶ All electronics must be out of sight, turned off and stored in backpacks once on campus unless allowed by the teacher and an electronic permission slip is signed by the parents.
- ▶ The school is not responsible for lost, stolen, missing, or damaged personal property.

◆FOOD ON CAMPUS

Eating on campus is only permitted in designated areas or at teacher supervised functions. Gum and sunflower seeds are not permitted on campus.

◆HEALTH NEEDS

The health office is available to students **who become ill or injured while at school. The health clerk is here on a part-time basis and is not a registered nurse.** If your student is ill in the morning, please keep him/her at home. The school does not have personnel to care for sick students. Students must advise their teacher prior to checking in at the health office. The office staff will call the parent if necessary.

- ▶ **MEDICATION:** Students may require medication at school. Unless the student/parent has followed the district's procedures

for self-administration of medication, **all medication must be kept in the health office.** Medical permission forms, available in the health office, must be completed and signed by the parent/guardian and physician and returned before medication can be administered. Students may not carry or store any medications on them at school without permission.

◆LOCKERS

- ▶ Lockers are assigned to each student as a convenient place in which to store books and appropriate personal possessions.
- ▶ School officials have the right to open lockers should they have just cause to suspect it contains inappropriate materials or items.
- ▶ **LOCKERS HAVE ONLY LIMITED SECURITY.** Please close and lock your locker properly for best assurance against theft. Fallon School is NOT responsible for locker content theft.
- ▶ Lockers are for students' convenience and are not to be shared or altered with stickers, shelves, or permanent fixtures.

COMBINATION DIALING INSTRUCTIONS

- ◆ **TURN RIGHT** two or more whole turns and stop at *first number.*
- ◆ **THEN TURN LEFT** one whole turn past above number and stop at *second number.*
- ◆ **NOW TURN RIGHT** and stop at *third number.*
- ◆ **LIFT LOCKER DOOR HANDLE.** Lock will automatically re-lock when door is closed.

◆CONTRABAND DOGS

As part of the DUSD's commitment to provide safe campuses and learning environments, contraband detection dogs will visit Fallon at random times throughout the year. The Interquest Company dogs are non-threatening breeds, and are an effective preventative measure in keeping the school free from drugs, medication, alcohol and firearms.

◆LOST AND FOUND

Lost and found articles will be kept in the lobby of the multi-purpose room. Unclaimed items will be donated to charity at the end of each grading period. For greater chance of recovery, place names on personal items.

◆**LEAVING CAMPUS DURING THE SCHOOL DAY**

If students are going to leave school during the day, THEY MUST SIGN OUT IN THE OFFICE. Permission to leave will be granted ONLY if they have a written note from home turned into the office or if a parent is present to sign them out. Students may only be picked up by an adult specified on the student's emergency card.

◆**VISITORS ON CAMPUS**

We strive to create a safe, hospitable environment for students, staff, and guests at Fallon School. Parents are always welcome to visit our school and classrooms. In order to make arrangements, we request 24-hour notice. All other visitors must receive prior approval from administration. Visitors are required to register in the main office and receive a visitor's pass. Students not enrolled at Fallon are not allowed to visit classrooms.

◆**STUDENT ID CARDS**

STUDENTS MUST CARRY THEIR ID CARDS AT ALL TIMES. These cards will be used in the library, to check out equipment, for purchasing food in the cafeteria, and for admission to all school activities. If an ID Card is lost, a replacement card must be purchased for \$5.00 in the office. Using another student's ID Card will result in disciplinary action.

◆**CLASS INTERRUPTIONS**

Forgotten lunches, homework, PE clothes, etc., are NOT considered emergencies. It is each student's responsibility to bring these items to school in the morning or to make arrangements for delivery that will not disturb class time. Any of these items brought to school by parents can be left in the school office and may be picked up between classes or during lunch. Items will not be delivered or announced.

◆**TEXTBOOKS**

Text and library books are the property of the Dublin Unified School District. All books should be covered and handled carefully. Issued texts are an important, direct responsibility of the student. Students will pay for any damage to or loss of textbooks (E.C. 19910). The school reserves the right to withhold privileges and impose consequences if this responsibility is not met.

◆**SCHOOL CAFETERIA**

Prepaid accounts are available and activated by student ID Cards. Payment may be made electronically with the use of myschoolbucks.com.

Students are required to show their own ID/Lunch Card in order to use their account. Cafeteria policies are posted and we expect all patrons to follow these rules. Service is provided for breakfast and lunch. Students are welcome to bring their own food or to purchase from our menu. In the event a student is unable to purchase a meal, they may be offered either a peanut butter or cheese sandwich and milk at no cost for two days. After that time, funds must be provided or lunch be brought from home.

◆**SCHOOL PHONE USE**

OFFICE PHONES ARE FOR EMERGENCY USE ONLY. Students may only use classroom phones in an emergency and with the permission of the teacher.

◆**CELL PHONE AND ELECTRONIC DEVICE USE**

Electronic devices are not to be visible or in use (without teacher permission) during school hours, including lunch. They are to be turned off and kept in backpacks or pocket once on campus. The District's cell phone policy will be followed in the event your student's electronic device is confiscated for improper use during school hours.

1st Offense: Phone is returned to the student after student returns the completed electronic device notification letter signed by parent/guardian.

2nd Offense: Parent/guardian must come to the school office and sign for release of the phone.

3rd Offense: Parent/guardian conference with the Assistant Principal.

4th Offense: Loss of school activities/privileges for 30 days.

5th Offense and Beyond: Possible suspension from school.

◆**SCHOOL PROPERTY**

Any student who defaces, damages, or destroys any school property may be liable for suspension or expulsion according to the nature of the offense. Parents and guardians are financially responsible for damage to school property by their children.

DRESS CODE

Clothing, jewelry or accessories (including body art) worn to school need to meet the following expectations:

- ▶ Undergarments will be covered. This applies to both genders. **NO SAGGING.**

- ▶ They will not detract from the educational process.
- ▶ They will not have any connection or reference to gang affiliation, alcohol, drugs, violence, intolerance or bigotry of any kind.
- ▶ They should not expose any anatomy (body parts) other than arms and legs.
- ▶ Headgear including hats, headbands, stocking caps, beanies, hairnets, bandanas, or "do" rags may be worn to and from school, but **MAY NOT** be worn inside buildings.

Exceptions are made for religious purposes and when outdoors during PE and lunch.

Shorts/skirts must be longer than thumb length when the arm is fully extended. Torn or ripped fabric must be below fingertip length when the arm is fully extended. Spaghetti straps or halters are not to be worn on campus.

In the event that a student fails to follow the policy, they can and will be asked to change into appropriate attire.

SCHOOL ACTIVITIES/ SERVICES

Fallon School has a number of after-school and evening activities for students. Attending these activities is a privilege, and students may be excluded from any school activity due to poor academic performance or behavior problems.

◆SPORTS

Fallon offers a variety of sports throughout the year, including basketball, track, wrestling, golf, and volleyball. Students who have achieved and maintained at least a 2.0 overall GPA will be eligible to participate in our sports program. Active team members must demonstrate good citizenship and sportsmanship. Student athletes are responsible for any work missed due to early release.

◆DANCES

Dances are provided for the enjoyment of Fallon students. Official permission slips and valid ID cards are required to purchase tickets to dances. Specific guidelines, hours, and rules are listed on each permission slip. Tickets are sold during lunch prior to the day of the dance. Tickets will not be sold at the door.

STUDENT RECOGNITION

◆MUSTANG OF THE MONTH INTEGRITY IN ACTION

Staff members nominate students for displaying exemplary behavior. These students receive special recognition and special awards at quarterly assemblies.

◆HONOR ROLL

Students are honored for demonstrating academic excellence each quarter.

3.5-3.99 GPA = Honor Roll

4.0 GPA = Principal's Honor Roll

FALLON SCHOOL DISCIPLINE PLAN

All students, staff and visitors are expected to know the rules and behavior expectations, as well as the consequences for those who choose not to follow them.

At Fallon School every student has a right to an education. Our school has developed consequences for students who choose to violate this right. Should a student misbehave, they may receive a discipline referral. Students who receive referrals may be assigned a detention. Referrals are accumulated over the entire school year as outlined in the discipline policy below.

◆SCHOOL DISCIPLINE STAGES

Stage 1: (Two demerit points)

Student loses next school dance/activity. Parent/guardian is contacted at each referral.

Stage 2: (Two more demerit points - total 4 points)

Student loses next/another school dance/activity. Parent/guardian is contacted at each referral. A student study team may be scheduled. Parent must attend.

Stage 3: (Two more demerit points - total 6 points)

Student loses next/another school dance/activity. At six points a mandatory meeting between parents and school officials will be scheduled.

Stage 4: (Two more demerit points - total 8 points)

Student is excluded from remaining school activities including end-of-the-year activities.

If a student wishes to remove a discipline point, he/she must be referral free for 20 school days from the last referral. The student must also complete community service to remove one (1) point. Point removal must be pre-approved by the administration.

◆STUDENT EXPECTATIONS

- ▶ Use acceptable language at all times.
- ▶ Keep hands, feet, and objects to yourself.
- ▶ Be on time and prepared to learn.
- ▶ Be courteous, cooperative, and respectful to yourself and others.
- ▶ Conduct yourself in a safe and appropriate manner.
- ▶ Follow directions the first time they are given.
- ▶ Only materials needed for learning are to be brought to school.

◆PERFUME AND COLOGNES

Students and staff members must be aware that some people have severe allergies to fragrances. Care must be taken when wearing or spraying perfumes, hair products, deodorants, etc. Students who use these products inappropriately may face disciplinary action.

◆CAUSES AND PROCEDURES FOR DISCIPLINARY ACTION

While the Education Code devotes considerable space to suspensions and expulsions, most of the disciplinary actions in the district are handled through conferences and detentions. Fallon School follows a disciplinary matrix.

◆CONFERENCE

Students will be counseled on appropriate school behavior.

◆TEACHER DETENTION

A teacher detention may be assigned by a staff member for disciplinary reasons. Teachers are allowed to give a 15-minute detention without notice, unless the student travels by public transportation. For longer detentions, twenty-four hour notice is given to allow for the student to arrange for transportation.

◆SCHOOL DETENTION

Detention is held before school from 7:45-8:30 am. Before-school detention requires an Administrator or teacher call home to notify parents. Students assigned detention will be responsible for arranging transportation. Carpools and public transportation

do not excuse students from detention. Students should bring pencil and paper along with work to be done. When a student has missed a detention because he/she is ill, the student will be reassigned the following week.

◆SATURDAY SCHOOL

Saturday School is held on selected Saturdays from 8:30am-12:30pm at Fallon School.

◆BEHAVIOR CONTRACT

An individual contract to address student's behavior may be developed to address inappropriate classroom or social interactions. Examples might include classroom disruption, bullying, teasing, etc.

◆EXCLUSION FROM SCHOOL ACTIVITY

Students can and will be excluded from school activities within 30 days of a disciplinary action such as suspension.

◆SUSPENSION

Suspension is used to remove a student from school for disciplinary reasons for a period of one to five days.

◆EXPULSION

Expulsion is used to remove a student from school for the remainder of the semester or school year for disciplinary reasons. Expulsion is a process that is used for very serious matters. Expulsion may occur only with the approval of the Board of Trustees.

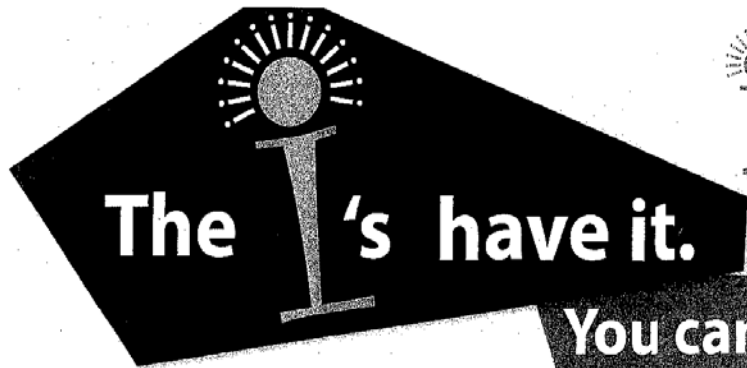
◆ED CODE VIOLATIONS

DISCIPLINE PLAN 2013-2014

Under certain circumstances or based on an individual's discipline record, the maximum consequence could be imposed on a first violation. Students are held accountable for acts related to a school activity or attendance that occur at any time including while on school grounds, going to or from school, lunch period, or any school sponsored activity in Dublin or in any other town.

Definitions:

1. "Controlled substance" means any drug or alcoholic substance listed in the Health and Safety Code.
2. "Day" means calendar days except for suspensions. Days for suspensions are weekdays that students would normally be expected to attend if they had not received a suspension.
3. "Expulsion" means removal from school of attendance and placement in an alternative setting, possibly outside Dublin. The severity of the violation determines the duration of the expulsion.
4. "Harassment" means to torment, annoy, or intimidate another person that causes physical or mental anxiety or creates a hostile educational environment.
5. "Imitation firearm" means a replica of a firearm that is so substantially similar in physical properties to an existing firearm as to lead a reasonable person to conclude the replica is a firearm. Education Code 48900 (m).
6. "Knife" means a dirk, dagger, or other weapon with a fixed, sharpened blade fitted primarily for stabbing, a folding blade that locks into place, a razor with an unguarded blade or a weapon with a blade longer than 3.5 inches. Education Code 48915 (g). **KNIVES OF ANY KIND ARE NOT ALLOWED ON CAMPUS.**
7. "Serious physical injury" means serious impairment of physical condition including loss of consciousness, bone fracture, loss or impairment of any body part, a wound requiring stitches, or serious disfigurement. Penal Code 243 (5).
8. "Suspension" means temporary removal from school for a maximum of 5 days per incident / 20 days per school year except in cases of expulsion or special education students.
